Deep peace of the flowing air to you.


Deep peace of the quiet earth to you.

(This text is the traditional blessing attributed to St. Columba, the 6th century Irish Abbot and missionary who brought Christianity to Scotland for the first time around 550 C.E. and founded the monastery on Iona. His Gaelic name,

"Colm Cille" (Church Dove) fits his message of Peace. Those from St. Andrews who traveled to Scotland received this blessing at the Kildalton cross on Islay from the Rev. Angus Morrison in 1997, and it has been a part of our liturgy ever since.)
